


UNNExT Single Window ChecklistPart I: Readiness







I Introduction

1. Background

A Single Window (SW) is an approach to efficiently coordinate process and data needed to satisfy trade-related regulatory requirements with single entry point for traders. Due to its potential benefits, many countries in Asia and the Pacific have already implemented Single Windows and many others also consider implementation. Implementing a Single Window is not simply developing a facility, but nurturing an enabling environment in many areas.

Understanding their readiness before implementing a Single Window enables countries to identify where their shortcomings are and make more practical planning for implementable model. In response to the High-Level Symposium on Building Regional Capacity for Paperless Trade, held on Mar. 24 - 25 2009 in Bangkok, Thailand, pointing out the "need for a checklist for action for establishment of a single window," ESCAP and UNECE have developed the Single Window Checklist with the support of the United Nations Network of Experts for Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific (UNNExT)

2. Purpose

To provide policy managers responsible for implementing single windows with an easy-to-follow reference checklist for assessing countries' readiness in basic requirements.

The benefits this checklist can bring about are as follows:

- ✓ It can assist countries to plan effectively, prior to SW implementation.
- ✓ An analysis of checklist results can reveal problem areas that need to be addressed early in the preparation process
- ✓ It will highlight areas which need capacity building and technical assistance
- ✓ It can point to solutions which are relatively easy for a country to undertake using its own resources
- ✓ It can indicate areas for which in-depth trade facilitation reform would be required
- ✓ It can help countries which are preparing to implement SEW to draft their Master Plan

3. Target Audiences

The checklist is intended to support policy managers¹ in the countries not implemented Single Windows yet, to assess and plan future implementation of a Single Window. The checklist can be also useful for the policy managers of those countries that already implemented Single Windows in planning future improvement.

4. Structure

¹ Policy managers are government officials who are in a position to prepare policy improvement recommendations and implement policies with specific programs.

The UNNExT Single Window Checklist is composed of two parts – Readiness and Implementation. Part I is readiness checklist, allowing national policy managers to assess their readiness in implementing a Single Window through a review of key aspects of enabling environment. Part II is implementation checklist, to be used in actual implementation of a Single Window as a practical guide. This checklist comprises Part I of UNNExT Single Window Checklist.


The Readiness Checklist is mainly composed of introduction, checklist and annexes:

- (1) Introduction explains background and purpose of the checklist, target audiences and its structure and usage;
- (2) Checklist is the actual checklist composed of questions to answer. National stakeholders may use it to assess their national readiness; and.
- (3) Annexes provide annotation to checklist, which supplies additional explanation on the questions in the checklist, and information on useful references for Single Window implementation.

The Checklist part is structured with questions around sub-categories belonging to one of 5 core categories as follows:

- ➤ Need and Will
- Political Commitment and Mandate

- ➤ Institutional Arrangement
- Legal Framework
- > Technical Competence



5. How to Use

Responding policy managers (Respondents) are to complete each question with Yes or No. If necessary and relevant, the Respondents are recommended to provide observations/comments in the corresponding space. If Respondents need additional information and clarification on question(s), they may refer to the Annotation provided in the Annex 1.

Upon completion of the checklist, consultants/advisors analyze the result of the completed checklist. Based on the result of the analysis, they identify the capacity gaps and capacity building needs.
