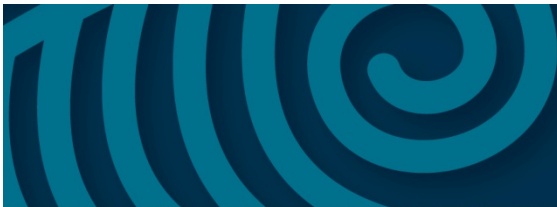

Background

- Historically, inter-island services have been provided by a variety of government and private sector shipowners, although the mix of public and private ownership has varied across FICs.
- The majority of FICs have legislation reserving coastal and inter-island trade for locally registered vessels, although the specific provisions of the legislation vary across the region.

Transport Study (2004).

Voyages – Shipping in the Pacific

Infrastructure Performance Indicators

SCAP study estimated that 50 percent of the region's domestic shipping was over twenty years old.

Given low replacement rates, the proportion of the fleet over twenty years old is expected to have increased since 1997.
