

What have we achieved so far?

□ Post 1993:

- 1994 Nepal developed National Action Plan on DM and presented in the Yokohama Conference;
- 1996 Government endorsed the Plan;
- Several I/NGOs, NRCS, etc. started DM activities;
- UNDP initiated PDMP;
- Large scale capacity development activities initiated;
- IDNDR 1990 1999/2000 awareness raising activities

What have we achieved so far?

□ Post 2000:

- NPC 10th Five Year development Plan & 3 year plan
- UNISDR 2000 awareness raising and capacity development activities
- Nepal prepared a national position paper for the 2005 IInd WCDM
- Re-thinking on our DM initiatives from post to pre-disaster
 - □ DRM in school curricula, risk transfer insurance, CBDRM, EW, risk assessment, Department of Drug Control and DM,
 - □ National Strategy on DRM, DM Act,
 - □ Flagship initiative

The CDRMP has been developed to support implementation of National Strategy for Disaster Risk Management (NSDRM).




The programme will also build partnerships with the existing national institutions to expand the institutional and knowledge base of DRM in Nepal.


Objectives


- □ Reduce the physical vulnerability through support for application and enforcement of building codes and bylaws;
