- □ Interventions/Discussion might be around key ISS parameters and issues such as:
 - Responsibilities (who provides); Benefits (what is provided and over what period of time); Beneficiaries (to whom and how they are selected); and Financing (how to finance)
 - Special parameters can also be included in order to accommodate and reflect specific country contexts.
