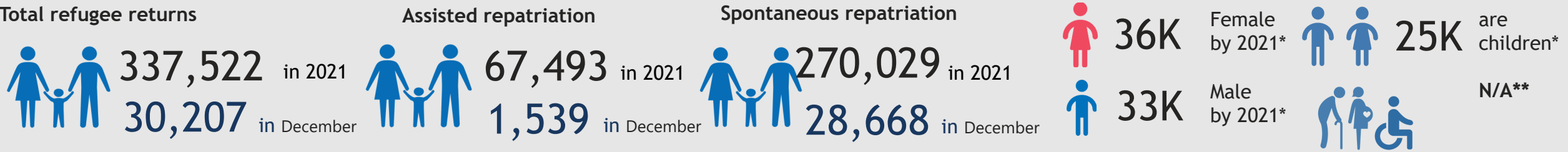

Background

While assisted returns in the region were suspended for most of 2020, movements resumed in early 2021 following the re-opening of borders and the progressive lifting of Covid-19 related movement restrictions. From January to December, **337,522** refugees were able to repatriate to their countries of origin. **64,673** Burundians continued to return at a steady rate from five countries of asylum with assistance from UNHCR and partners, with the majority returning from Rwanda and Tanzania, although a slowing down has been observed since September. Uganda also recently started returns to Burundi. **267,760** South Sudanese have also spontaneously returned, mainly from Uganda, Sudan, Ethiopia, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and Kenya. **2,595** Somalis returned, assisted from Eritrea and Kenya and spontaneously from Yemen. **766** Ethiopians returned to Ethiopia from Dadaab refugee camp in Kenya. **1,728** Rwandans returned to Rwanda from the DRC.

Challenges: Logistical constraints of organizing returns in the context of Covid-19 remains a challenge. Support for long-term reintegration activities in countries of origin remains limited, despite ongoing efforts to engage development actors. Additional funding remains critically needed to strengthen returnee monitoring in Burundi.
