## **An Overview**Of The Indonesian Disaster Resilient Villages

Foreword

In 2017, the Ministry of Social Affairs and the World Food Programme (WFP) signed a Program Document containing a collaboration agreement to improve its disaster response capacity.

One of the agreed priority activities is a study on Disaster Resilient Village (KSB), the main program under the Ministry of Social Affairs to reduce the disaster risk at the local level. A report was generated from said study elaborating the lessons learned from several KSBs, which served as the sample of the study. The study was conducted utilizing a systematic methodology following academic principles.

In addition to the preliminary study, the Ministry of Social Affairs also required WFP to provide a summary of several narratives using a humanitarian approach. The summary will be used to retell problems and challenges faced by the KSBs in the field, as well as the accomplishments at the local and national level. The narratives are written in a simpler language to ensure all layers of the community understand the moral values is communicated. The result of the process is an overview of ten stories from the KSBs visited. Despite only covering the one-third of the total number of KSBs visited, the stories presented are expected to represent the uniqueness of KSB in Indonesia.

At last, WFP would like to appreciate and thank the parties who have helped with the development of this overview, namely the Ministry of Social Affairs, Office of Social Welfare, and representatives from the KSB, the parties that welcomed the visits by the WFP team and allocated time to conduct a series of interviews and focus group discussions. We hope that the KSB Study Report and the Overview will be beneficial. Especially for KSBs all over Indonesia, the Ministry of Social Affairs as well as other organizations that are conducting disaster management activities.
