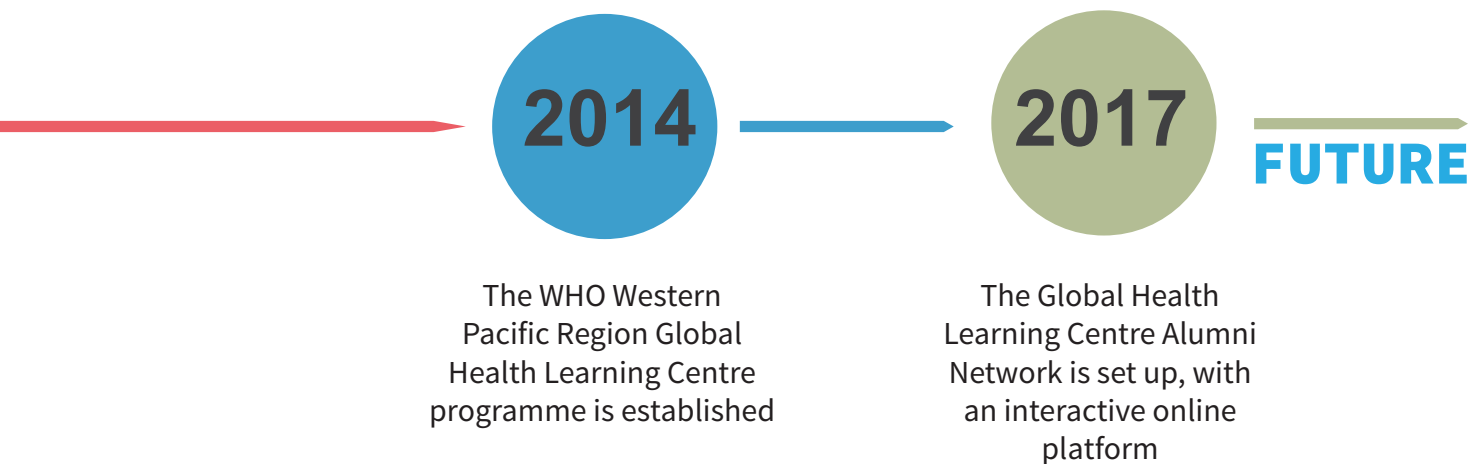

THE GHLC FELLOWS

An earlier version of the programme trained approximately 450 Fellows between 1986 and 2003. These Fellows came from Cambodia, China, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Mongolia and Viet Nam. Approximately 150 women and 300 men were trained during this period.

The programme was resumed in its current form in 2014. The pioneer cohort of GHLC 2014 had 15 Fellows (7 women and 8 men). By the end of 2016, GHLC produced a total of 45 graduates (23 women and 22 men). They hailed from Cambodia, China, Japan, the Republic of Korea, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Macao SAR (China), Mongolia, the Philippines, Samoa and Viet Nam.

The GHLC 2017 cohort comprises 27 Fellows (18 women and 9 men), who are from Cambodia, China, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malaysia, Mongolia, the Philippines, Samoa and Viet Nam. We wish our Fellows a wonderful learning experience during this year's course!
