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FOREWORD

I am pleased to present Monitoring Universal Health Coverage and Health in the Sustainable Development Goals: Baseline Report for the Western Pacific Region 2017. The report is expected to serve as a benchmark for assessing progress in implementing the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and actions towards universal health coverage (UHC) over the next 14 years.

The report has three purposes. First, it describes the baseline situation for UHC and health in the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the Region, including equity-focused monitoring. Second, it introduces analyses, techniques and tools that can inform policy dialogue and policy-making. Finally, it highlights current limitations in monitoring the SDGs and UHC in an effort to inform future action plans and technical work in the Region.

The report can serve as a guide, but is not a substitute for each country's own monitoring framework. Countries can use the report to identify priorities for action over the next 14 years, including areas where progress is needed and areas where further country-specific analysis and review are required, as well as areas that currently have no data that can be used to assess progress. Countries can also use the report to foster dialogue on progress and to encourage knowledge-sharing and reciprocal learning both within countries and among countries at the regional level.

In addition to presenting the regional baseline situation, the report highlights critical elements of monitoring, and it provides to those involved in monitoring a deeper appreciation of the complexities of the process, as well as practical knowledge and techniques for the systematic monitoring of the SDGs and UHC. Countries are expected to use this report as a benchmark not only to support their own monitoring efforts and activities, but to assist in the formulation of evidence-informed policies, programmes and practices targeting health system development.

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
