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# SUMMARY DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

All members of the Guideline Group were asked to complete a WHO declaration of interest form. Six people declared potential conflicts of interest:

Abbie Jung worked for an organization with interest in the area of the outcomes of the meeting (Médecins sans Frontières from 2006-2008). Winnie Kalyesubulya declared that the outcomes from the meeting would benefit the interests of people with whom she has substantial common personal, financial or professional interest. Fabienne Hejoaka declared that she has been paid for consulting work and has received support (grants and in nonmonetary support) for research related to the outcomes of the meeting, from the Bernard van Leer Foundation. Paul Montgomery declared that he has received support from the John Fell Fund, University of Oxford, for research related to the outcomes of this meeting. Nathan Tumwesigye declared that he works for the African Network for Care of Children Affected by HIV/AIDS (ANECCA) that provides HIV care to children and disclosure is part of the package of care provided. Rachel Baggaley-Faussett declared that the organization she worked for, Christian AID, received support for research in work on orphans and vulnerable children.

The Steering Group did not consider any of these declarations to be reason for a Guideline Group member to recuse themselves. Thus, all participants were involved in development of the guidelines.

Declarations of interest forms also were collected from the non-WHO peer reviewers. No peer reviewer declared a potential conflict of interest.
