No. 5499. PAYMENTS AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE KINGDOM OF NORWAY AND THE FEDERAL PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA. SIGNED AT OSLO, ON 18 NOVEMBER 1959

In order to facilitate the payments between the Kingdom of Norway and the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia the Royal Norwegian Government and the Government of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia have agreed as follows :

Article 1

All payments between Norway and Yugoslavia, subject to the foreign exchange control regulations in force in the two countries, shall be affected in convertible Norwegian kroner through the accounts mentioned in Article 2.

Article 2

Norges Bank, Oslo, shall open an account in convertible Norwegian kroner in the name of the National Bank of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia. This account, free of charge and interest, shall always show a credit balance.

Norwegian authorized banks may open accounts in convertible Norwegian kroner in the name of the National Bank of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia or authorized Yugoslav banks. Such accounts shall always show credit balances.

Transfers may be effected between the above mentioned kroner accounts.

Transfers to the debit or credit of the above mentioned kroner accounts may be effected to the credit or debit of kroner accounts which Norges Bank or Norwegian authorized banks have opened in the name of banks in countries included in the convertible area, as defined by the Norwegian foreign exchange regulations in force, or in any other country as mutually agreed upon.

The National Bank of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia or authorized Yugoslav banks may—at the market rates at any time prevailing in Oslo—buy, respectively sell, to the debit or credit of the above mentioned kroner accounts the currencies of the convertible countries area as defined by the Norwegian foreign exchange regulations in force and other currencies as agreed upon by the two central banks.

The above mentioned transactions may be subject to the approval of the foreign exchange authorities in the third countries concerned.

Article 3

Norges Bank and the National Bank of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia shall agree between themselves on all technical details for the execution of the present Agreement.

Article 4

This agreement supersedes the Payments Agreement of the August 30, 1946,¹ signed between Norway and Yugoslavia.

Payments relating to contracts concluded during the validity of that Agreement will be effected in accordance with the present Agreement.

The balance of the National Bank of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia in clearing account with Norges Bank will be settled by a special arrangement.

Article 5

This Agreement will come into force when it shall be approved by the appropriate authorities of the two countries. It shall be applied as from the day on which Norges Bank and the National Bank of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia shall agree upon but not later than December 1, 1959.

The Agreement shall remain in force until further notice provided that a three months notice has not been given by either Contracting Party with the intention to terminate it.

AGREED MINUTES

On the occasion of the signing of the Payments Agreement between the Kingdom of Norway and the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia in Oslo on the 18th November 1959.²

With reference to the Payments Agreement between the Kingdom of Norway and the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia, it is understood that the Norwegian authorities will continue to apply the same liberalisation measures to the importation of Yugoslav goods as to imports from the OEEC countries. Likewise it is understood that the Norwegian authorities are also prepared to apply the same liberalisation measures concerning export to Yugoslavia as concerning exports to the OEEC countries.

Moreover, it is understood that the Norwegian authorities will agree to consider establishing certain import quotas for some non-liberalised commodities, and that this matter may be taken up during the next formal trade negotiations between the two countries.

EXCHANGE OF LETTERS

Oslo, 18th November 1959

Your Excellency,

In accordance with the Payments Agreement signed today¹ between our two countries, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that payments mentioned in Art. 1 of the Payments Agreement are understood to be all current payments as provided in Art. XIX/1 of the Agreement on the International Monetary Fund² and especially payments which were covered by the Payments Agreement between Norway and Yugoslavia of August 30, 1946.

I have the honour further to propose that, if the foregoing arrangements are acceptable to the Government of the Kingdom of Norway this letter, together with Your Excellency's reply to that effect shall constitute an agreement between our two Governments.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurances of my highest consideration.
