YUGOSLAV DELEGATION

Athens, 11 September 1956

Your Excellency,

In the course of the negotiations which the Yugoslav and Greek delegations conducted at Athens from 11 June to 11 September 1956, consideration was given to means of achieving closer co-operation between the competent authorities and the tourist agencies and services of the two countries with a view to improving the conditions for the expansion of tourist traffic between our two countries.

The two delegations were gratified to note their identity of views on the importance, for our two countries and for our general co-operative efforts, of a development of touring and they confirmed the common desire of their Governments to take suitable measures to encourage action taken by agencies, institutions, and services dealing with questions of tourism in their countries to enter into contact for the purpose of improving, by their joint efforts and close co-operation, conditions for tourism between our two countries in their respective sectors.

With this end in view, our delegations agreed to recommend that their respective Governments, as a first step in the joint development of touring, should :

(1) Simplify to the greatest possible extent, on a reciprocal basis, the procedures for the issue of tourist visas, for the purpose of facilitating tourist travel by nationals of the two countries and of third countries;

(2) Give the necessary instructions to the official tourist organizations of the two countries to enter into contact for the purpose of preparing a joint programme of tourist publicity in the two countries and abroad and to agree on the preparation of joint travel plans for visits by foreign tourists to the two countries;
