Sir :

I have the honour to refer to recent discussions between the officials of our two Governments concerning the Colombo Plan for Co-operative Economic Development in South and South-East Asia. The officials reached agreement on the general principles under which all Canadian assistance to the Government of India under the Plan should be made available.

As you know, it is the practice of the Parliament of Canada to vote funds on an annual basis and the amounts provided must be reviewed from year to year. For this year certain funds have been provided for the Colombo Plan and the Government of Canada now wishes to establish agreed principles to guide the activities of our respective governments in the furtherance of the Plan.

For this purpose I attach a "Statement of Principles agreed between the Government of Canada and the Government of India for Co-operative Economic Development of India."²
