Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement constituted by the Exchange of Notes of the 12th of September, 1949,² between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of San Marino concerning the mutual abolition of visas, and to inform Your Excellency that as a further measure towards encouraging tourist traffic a simplified form of passport known as the British Visitor's Passport will be made available for issue from the 15th of March, 1961, to British subjects, citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies. A British Visitor's Passport will be valid for one year from the date of issue. An applicant for a British Visitor's Passport will not be required by the United Kingdom authorities to produce documentary evidence of his identity and national status, but he will be required to sign a declaration that he is a British subject, citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies. A specimen of the British Visitor's Passport is attached as an Annex³ to this Note.

2. I have now the honour to propose an Agreement between the two Governments in the following terms :

(a) The Government of San Marino undertakes to accept the British Visitor's Passport as a valid passport and to permit holders to enter and stay in San Marino without the necessity of obtaining a visa subject to the following conditions :
