GENERAL AGREEMENT¹ FOR A PROGRAMME OF SCIENTIFIC CO-OPERATION IN THE FIELD OF BIO-MEDICINE BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA REPRESENTED BY THE NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH AND PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF GHANA REPRESENTED BY THE NATIONAL RESEARCH COUNCIL OF GHANA. SIGNED AT ACCRA, ON 3 JANUARY 1962

WHEREAS discussions have been held by representatives of the National Institutes of Health of the United States of America and the National Research Council of Ghana concerning scientific and technical co-operation which may extend to other services or representatives designated by the Governments of the United States of America and Ghana :

AND WHEREAS the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the Republic of Ghana desire by mutual agreement and in a spirit of friendly co-operation between the two Governments to establish collaboration in research and training in Bio-Medicine within the framework of the National Institute of Health in Ghana

NOW THEREFORE it is agreed as follows :

1. The National Institutes of Health, Public Health Service (hereinafter referred to as "The Institutes of Health") acting on behalf of the Government of the United States of America will undertake to establish scientific field units in collaboration with the National Institute of Health and Medical Research of the National Research Council of Ghana (hereinafter referred to as "The Council") acting on behalf of the Government of the Republic of Ghana. The scientific field units of the Institutes of Health will provide research personnel trained in bio-medical sciences to study bio-medical problems in Ghana which are immediately necessary for alleviating the burden of ill-health of the people of Ghana and other parts of Africa and which are of mutual interest to the Government of Ghana and the Government of the United States of America.
