The Ambassador of the United States of America presents his compliments to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Honduras, and has the honor to refer to his conversation of May 18, 1954 with the Foreign Minister preparatory to the Bilateral Military Assistance Agreement between the Government of Honduras and the Government of the United States of America which was signed at Tegucigalpa May 20, 1954.²

Confirming the oral understanding reached by the Foreign Minister and the Ambassador in the above conversation, the Ambassador informs the Foreign Minister that the Government of the United States of America proposes the following arrangements under Article I, Paragraph 3, of the Military Assistance Agreement, regarding the disposition of equipment and materials furnished by the United States of America under that Agreement and no longer required for the purposes for which originally made available :

1. The Government of Honduras will report to the United States personnel discharging United States responsibilities in Honduras under the Military Assistance Agreement such equipment and materials furnished under end item programs as are no longer required for the purposes for which originally made available. It is understood that such personnel of the Government of the United States may also inform the Government of Honduras of any such equipment and materials which may come to the attention of the Government of the United States.

2. The United States Government may accept title to such equipment and materials for transfer to a third country or for such other disposition as may be made by the United States Government.

3. When title is accepted by the United States Government, such equipment and materials will be delivered free alongside ship in case ocean shipment is required, or deliv-
