Honorable Premier :

I have the honor to refer to recent conversations between representatives of our two governments and to propose the following understandings with respect to the men and women of the United States of America who volunteer to serve in the Peace Corps and who, at the request of your Government, would live and work for periods of time in Jamaica.

1. The Government of the United States will furnish such Peace Corps Volunteers as may be requested by the Government of Jamaica and approved by the Government of the United States to perform mutually agreed tasks in Jamaica. The Volunteers will work under the immediate supervision of governmental or private organizations in Jamaica designated by our two governments. The Government of the United States will provide training to enable the Volunteers to perform more effectively these agreed tasks.

2. The Government of Jamaica will accord equitable treatment to the Volunteers and their property; afford them full aid and protection, including treatment no less favorable than that accorded generally to nationals of the United States residing in Jamaica; and fully inform, consult and cooperate with representatives of the Government of the United States with respect to all matters concerning them. The Government of Jamaica will exempt the Volunteers from all taxes on payments which they receive to defray their living costs and on income from sources outside Jamaica, from all customs duties or other charges on their personal property introduced into Jamaica for their own use at or about the time of their arrival, and from all other taxes or other charges
