No. 6309. CONVENTION¹ ON CULTURAL CO-OPERATION
BETWEEN THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST RE-
PUBLICS AND THE REPUBLIC OF SENEGAL. SIGNED
IN MOSCOW, ON 14 JUNE 1962

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, on the one hand, and

The Government of the Republic of Senegal, on the other,

Desiring to broaden and strengthen cultural relations between the two countries with a view to the development of friendly relations and the strengthening of mutual understanding between the Soviet and Senegalese people, have agreed as follows :

Article I

The Contracting Parties undertake to encourage co-operation between the two countries in every possible way in the fields of science, technology, education, health, literature, the arts, and the cinema, with a view to fostering a better appreciation of their respective cultures and intellectual life as well as the exchange of experience in these fields.

Article II

The Contracting Parties agree to provide each other, as far as possible, with mutual assistance in the training of national personnel in industry, agriculture, science, education, health and culture through the exchange of trainees, specialists or other persons working in these fields.

Article III

Each Contracting Party shall, under a special arrangement, provide a specified number of places and scholarships for the trainees and specialists of the other Party in the appropriate institutions of its own country and shall, as far as possible, assist the nationals of the other Party in enrolling in such institutions for study or further training.

Each Contracting Party shall, for the purposes of registration in its universities and higher academic or technical education institutions, recognize diplomas issued on the completion of studies in the secondary, higher or technical education institutions of the other Party, as well as university degrees.
