No. 6342. PEACE CORPS AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC. SIGNED AT WASHINGTON, ON 2 MAY 1962

The Government of the United States of America and the Government of the Dominican Republic, desiring to provide a basis for a Peace Corps program under which men and women of the United States of America who volunteer to serve in the Peace Corps would, at the request of the Government of the Dominican Republic, live and work for periods of time in the Dominican Republic, agree as follows :

1. The Government of the United States will furnish such Peace Corps Volunteers as may be requested by the Government of the Dominican Republic and approved by the Government of the United States to perform mutually agreed tasks in the Dominican Republic. The Volunteers will work under the immediate supervision of governmental or private organizations in the Dominican Republic designated by the two governments. The Government of the United States will provide training to enable the Volunteers to perform more effectively their agreed tasks.

2. The Government of the Dominican Republic will accord equitable treatment to the Volunteers and their property ; afford them full aid and protection, including treatment no less favorable than that accorded generally to nationals of the United States residing in the Dominican Republic ; and fully inform, consult and cooperate with representatives of the Government of the United States with respect to all matters concerning them. The Government of the Dominican Republic will exempt the Volunteers from all taxes on payments which they receive to defray their living costs and on income from sources outside the Dominican Republic, from all customs duties or other charges on their personal property introduced into the Dominican Republic for their own use at or about the time of their arrival, and from all other taxes or other charges (including immigration fees) except license fees and taxes or other charges included in the prices of equipment, supplies and services.

3. The Government of the United States will provide the Volunteers with such limited amounts of equipment and supplies as the two governments may agree are needed to enable the Volunteers to perform their tasks effectively. The Government
