No. 6431. CONVENTION¹ BETWEEN THE STATE OF ISRAEL
AND THE REPUBLIC OF GUATEMALA CONCERNING
CULTURAL EXCHANGES. SIGNED AT GUATEMALA,
ON 27 NOVEMBER 1961

The Government of Israel and the Government of Guatemala, desiring to reinforce the friendly relations between the State of Israel and the Republic of Guatemala ;

Considering that the ties between the two peoples can be still further strengthened by the dissemination of information about the progress achieved in each of the two countries in the intellectual, scientific and artistic fields ; and

Aware that the spiritual heritage of the two peoples is likely to afford valuable interchanges between the nationals and the cultural organizations of their respective countries ;

Have decided to conclude a Convention to this end and have appointed as their plenipotentiaries :

The President of the State of Israel :

Mr. Joshua N. Shai, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary ;

The President of the Republic of Guatemala :

Mr. Jesús Unda Murillo, Minister for Foreign Affairs ;

who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form, have agreed as follows :

Article I

The High Contracting Parties undertake to intensify and facilitate cultural exchanges between them and to support each other's programmes designed to achieve that end.

Article II

The High Contracting Parties shall promote and facilitate, cultural scientific and artistic exchanges between their peoples. They shall in particular :
