Your Excellency,

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that, with a view to facilitating travel between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Honduras, the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland are prepared to conclude with the Government of the Republic of Honduras an agreement in the following terms :

(a) Honduran nationals holding valid Honduras passports shall be free to travel from any place whatever to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, The Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, without the necessity of obtaining a visa in advance.

(b) British subjects holding valid passports bearing on the cover the inscription "British Passport" at the top and, at the bottom, the inscription "United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland" or "Jersey" or "Guernsey and its Dependencies", and, inside, the description of the holder's national status as "British subject" or "British subject, citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies", or "British subject, citizen of the United Kingdom, Islands and Colonies", shall be free to travel from any place whatever to the Republic of Honduras without the necessity of obtaining a visa in advance, and to leave the Republic of Honduras without being required to obtain an exit visa. Any such visit to the Republic of Honduras shall be limited to a period of three months, unless extended by the Honduran authorities at the termination of this period for a further period of three months.

(c) The waiver of the visa requirement shall not exempt Honduran nationals coming to the United Kingdom, The Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, or British subjects
