Your Excellency,

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that, with a view to facilitating travel between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and El Salvador, the Government of the United Kingdom are prepared to conclude with the Government of El Salvador an agreement in the following terms :

(a) Salvadorean nationals holding valid Salvadorean passports shall be free to travel from any place whatever to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, without the necessity of obtaining a visa in advance.

(b) British subjects holding valid passports bearing on the cover the inscription "British Passport" at the top, and at the bottom the inscription "United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland" or "Jersey" or "Guernsey and its Dependencies", and inside the description of the holder's national status as "British subject" or "British subject, citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies" or "British subject, citizen of the United Kingdom Islands and Colonies", who do not intend to take up residence in El Salvador or set up in business or undertake employment or any activity yielding profit there, shall be free to travel to El Salvador from any place whatever without the necessity of obtaining a visa in advance, and to leave El Salvador without obtaining a permit to leave. Such a visit shall be limited to three months, but may be prolonged by the Salvadorean authorities in accordance with the appropriate regulations.

(c) It is understood that the waiver of the visa requirement does not exempt Salvadorean nationals and British subjects coming respectively to the United Kingdom or the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man and to El Salvador from the necessity of complying
