Excellency :

I have the honor to refer to recent conversations between representatives of our two Governments and to propose the following understandings with respect to the men and women of the United States of America who volunteer to serve in the Peace Corps and who, at the request of your Government, would live and work for periods of time in Guinea.

1. The Government of the United States will furnish such Peace Corps Volunteers as may be requested by the Government of Guinea and approved by the Government of the United States to perform mutually agreed tasks in Guinea. The Volunteers will work under the immediate supervision of governmental or private organizations in Guinea designated by our two Governments. The Government of the United States will provide training to enable the Volunteers to perform more effectively their agreed tasks.

2. The Government of Guinea will accord equitable treatment to the Volunteers and their property ; afford them full aid and protection, including treatment no less favorable than that accorded generally to nationals of the United States residing in Guinea ; and fully inform, consult and cooperate with representatives of the Government of the United States with respect to all matters concerning them. The Government of Guinea will exempt the Volunteers from all taxes on payments which they receive to defray their living costs and on income from sources outside Guinea, from all customs duties or other charges on their personal property introduced into Guinea for their own use at or about the time of their arrival, and from all other taxes or other charges (including immigration fees) except license fees and taxes or other charges included in the prices of equipment, supplies and services.
