Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, desiring to facilitate the movement of persons between the Kingdom of the Netherlands and the Principality of Monaco, is prepared to conclude an agreement with the Princely Government of Monaco in the following terms :

Article 1

1. Netherlands nationals, irrespective of their country of residence, may enter and leave the Principality of Monaco by all frontiers on presentation of one of the following documents :

A national passport of the Kingdom of the Netherlands which is currently valid or whose validity has expired less than five years previously ;

A valid tourist card (*toeristenkaart*).

2. The facilities provided for in the preceding paragraph shall apply only for periods of residence of three months or less.

A valid national passport shall still be required for all longer periods of residence.

Article 2

1. Monegasque nationals, irrespective of their country of residence, may enter and leave the territory of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in Europe by all frontiers on presentation of one of the following documents :

A national passport which is currently valid or whose validity has expired less than five years previously ;
