Sir,

I am instructed and have the honour to inform you that, with a view to promoting the development of tourist and trade relations between the Netherlands and Bolivia, the Netherlands Government is prepared to conclude with the Bolivian Government an agreement based on the following provisions :

1. Netherlands nationals holding a valid national passport, whether a diplomatic, consular, service or ordinary passport, may enter, stay in and travel in transit through Bolivia without being required to obtain a visa.

2. Bolivian nationals holding a valid national passport, whether a diplomatic, consular, official, special or ordinary passport, may enter, stay in and travel in transit through the Netherlands without being required to obtain a visa.

3. Netherlands nationals wishing to remain in Bolivia for more than three months must obtain the corresponding residence visa from the competent Bolivian diplomatic or consular agent before departure.

4. Bolivian nationals wishing to remain in the Netherlands for more than three months must obtain a temporary residence permit from the competent Netherlands diplomatic or consular agent before departure.

5. Netherlands nationals and Bolivian nationals who are established in the territory of the other Party and who travel abroad shall not be required to obtain a visa for their return journey.

6. It is agreed that the abolition of the travel visa shall also make it unnecessary to obtain an exit visa or to comply with any other formality in order to leave the two countries.
