No. 7213. AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF TURKEY CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF WIRE TELEPHONE COMMUNICATIONS AND THE EXISTING RADIO-TELEGRAPH SERVICE. SIGNED AT ANKARA, ON 9 JUNE 1962

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic of the one part and the Government of the Republic of Turkey of the other part, desiring to establish wire telephone communications and to regulate the existing radio-telegraph service between the two Countries, have decided to conclude this Agreement and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries :

For the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics :

Mr. Nikita S. Ryzhov, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics to Turkey.

For the Government of the Republic of Turkey :

Mr. Cahit S. Hayta, Minister Plenipotentiary, Assistant Secretary General for Political Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The undersigned plenipotentiaries, having exhibited their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows :

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

The telephone service between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Republic of Turkey shall be provided by means of the existing direct telephone links Moscow-Sofia, Sofia-Istanbul, and Moscow-Bucharest, Bucharest-Istanbul.

The establishment in the future of direct wire telephone communications between Moscow and Ankara via Leninakan-Kars shall be a subject of study between the two Governments.
