No. 7356. AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE SOCIALIST FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA CONCERNING CO-OPERATION IN PUBLIC HEALTH. SIGNED AT BELGRADE, ON 5 OCTOBER 1963

The Government of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic and the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, desiring to extend to public health the development of friendly relations and co-operation between the peoples of the two countries, have decided to conclude the following Agreement :

Article 1

The Contracting Parties shall develop and foster co-operation in all questions connected with public health, in particular by :

(a) The establishment of direct relations and co-operation between the public health authorities and scientific research institutes of the two countries;

(b) The exchange of scientists and specialists for purposes of study, further specialization and the sharing of experience;

(c) Participation in congresses, conferences, seminars and symposia organized in the territory of both Contracting Parties;

(d) The exchange of information on important organizational measures in the field of public health;

(e) The exchange of experience on the application of therapeutic methods and measures in the field of health care, particularly as regards industrial hygiene and occupational diseases, anti-epidemic hygiene services, health education, the use of therapeutic procedures and medicines, and standards governing health establishments and medical apparatus and instruments;

(f) The exchange of specialist and scientific literature, and regulations relating to public health;

(g) The exchange of information in regard to the training and advanced training of public health personnel;

(h) The exchange of public health statistics, and

(i) The exchange of information on the incidence of communicable diseases and on protective measures adopted and action taken to combat communicable diseases.
