No. 7466. AGREEMENT¹ ON TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION
BETWEEN THE STATE OF ISRAEL AND THE RWAN-
DESE REPUBLIC. SIGNED AT JERUSALEM, ON 23 OC-
TOBER 1962

The Government of the State of Israel and the Government of the Rwandese Republic,

Earnestly desiring to promote closer relations in the sphere of economic, technical and scientific co-operation between their two countries, and conscious of the benefits to be derived for this purpose from the conclusion of technical assistance agreements designed to encourage the exchange of knowledge and experimental results relating to activities likely to contribute to the development of the economic resources and productive capacity of the two countries, and to the greater well-being of their peoples,

Have decided to conclude an agreement on technical co-operation and for this purpose have appointed as their duly authorized plenipotentiaries :

The Government of the State of Israel :

Her Excellency Mrs. Golda Meir, Minister for Foreign Affairs ;

The Government of the Rwandese Republic :

His Excellency Mr. Callixte Habamenshi, Minister for Foreign Affairs and the National Plan ;

Who have agreed as follows :

Article I

Mindful of the tasks that have been given the highest priority in their two countries and of the experience each has acquired, the two Governments consider the following fields of activity to be those most suitable for collaboration and mutual assistance between the two countries :

- (a) Study of agricultural development and training of manpower needed for development projects ;
- (b) Study of public health problems and training of doctors and of medical staff needed to raise the standard and efficiency of medical services ;
