EXCHANGE OF NOTES CONSTITUTING AN ARRANGEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THAILAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CHIENGMAI TRAINING AND EXPERIMENTAL CENTRE FOR ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FEEDING AND DAIRYING. BANGKOK, 31 OCTOBER AND 23 DECEMBER 1964

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The Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Thailand, and with reference to the Agreement² between the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany and the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand of April 2, 1964, regarding Technical Cooperation, has the honour to communicate the following :

The Government of the Federal Republic of Germany, desiring to support the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand in its efforts for an intensive development of its country's agriculture, proposes to the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand the following Arrangement :

1. The Government of the Federal Republic of Germany and the Government of the Federal Republic of Thailand shall jointly establish the Chiangmai Training and Experimental Centre for Animal Husbandry, Feeding and Dairying (hereinafter called the "Training and Experimental Centre").

2. The tasks of the "Training and Experimental Centre" shall be :

- a) to establish an adequate premunization method as a prerequisite to the productive existence of European cattle breeds in Thailand by veterinary research into the causing agents, typical for the country, of the tick-borne diseases Anaplasmosis and Piroplasmosis ;
- b) to counteract deficiency diseases, detrimental to the productivity of cattle, by determining the mineral and trace element content of plants and soils and by introducing appropriate feeding measures ;
