No. 7639. AGREEMENT¹ ON THE CULTURAL CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS AND THE REPUBLIC OF TANGANYIKA. SIGNED AT DAR ES SALAAM, ON 6 NOVEMBER 1963

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Government of the Republic of Tanganyika being desirous of expanding cultural relations between the two countries in the interest of further developing and strengthening the friendly relations and mutual understanding subsisting between the peoples of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the peoples of the Republic of Tanganyika have agreed on the following articles :

Article I

The Contracting Parties will promote the exchange of experience in the fields of science, higher learning, public education, health, literature, the arts and sports by facilitating visits by delegations and individuals between their countries.

Article II

The Contracting Parties will promote the study by their peoples of the culture of the country of the other Party. To this end, and on the basis of mutual agreement, each Contracting Party will facilitate the presentation in its country of concerts, exhibitions and lectures by musicians, artists and other citizens of the other country and shall seek to promote cultural exchange between appropriate non-governmental organizations in the two countries.

Article III

The Contracting Parties will encourage co-operation on a mutually acceptable basis in the fields of press, broadcasting and cinema and will consult together to promote exchange of visits by journalists and those working in the field of radio and the cinema, distribution of cinema films or the production of radio and musical programmes.

Article IV

The Contracting Parties agree to seek methods by which they may render to each other assistance in the training of personnel for industry, agriculture,
