No. 7740. TRADE AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF CHINA AND THE REPUBLIC OF ECUADOR. SIGNED AT QUITO, ON 17 JUNE 1964

The Government of the Republic of China and the Government of the Republic of Ecuador, animated by their desire to develop the trade relations between the two countries in an atmosphere of friendship and understanding, have decided to conclude a Trade Agreement and, for this purpose, have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries :

His Excellency the President of the Republic of China, Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek :

His Excellency Mr. Hsu Peh-yuan, Governor of the Central Bank of China and concurrently Chairman of the Foreign Exchange and Trade Commission of the Executive Yuan of the Republic of China ; and

Their Excellencies Members of the Military Board of Government of the Republic of Ecuador, Rear-Admiral Ramón Castro Jijón, President ; General of Division Marcos Gándara Enríquez, General of Division Luis Cabrera Sevilla and Colonel of the General Staff of the Air Force Guillermo Freile Posso, Members :

His Excellency Dotor Gonzalo Escudero, Minister of Foreign Affairs :

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles :

Article I

The High Contracting Parties, according to their respective laws and regulations on Trade and Foreign Exchange, shall apply the dispositions of this Agreement to promote commercial relations between the two countries.

Article II

The High Contracting Parties shall take adequate measures with a view to facilitate the exchange of products and the competent authorities of the two countries shall extend the necessary authorizations for import and export, in accordance with the laws and regulations of their respective countries.
