No. 7817. AGREEMENT¹ ON CULTURAL CO-OPERATION
BETWEEN THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC
AND THE DEMOCRATIC AND POPULAR REPUBLIC
OF ALGERIA. SIGNED AT PRAGUE, ON 14 MAY 1964

The Government of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic and the Government of the Democratic and Popular Republic of Algeria,

Desiring to develop all relations and co-operation between the two countries in the fields of culture, education, science and the arts in order to increase and strengthen the ties of friendship existing between the peoples of the two countries,

Have decided to conclude this Agreement and have for that purpose appointed as their plenipotentiaries :

The Government of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic :

Mr. Václav David, Minister for Foreign Affairs;

The Government of the Democratic and Popular Republic of Algeria :

Mr. Abdelaziz Bouteflika, Minister for Foreign Affairs,

who, having exchanged their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed on the following provisions :

Article 1

Each of the two Contracting Parties shall contribute, on the basis of respect for the principle of equal rights of national sovereignty and of non-interference in the domestic affairs of the other Party, to the promotion and development of cultural relations between the two countries, to knowledge of each other's cultural wealth by the peoples of the two countries, and to the progress achieved in the fields of culture, education, science and the arts.

Article 2

The Contracting Parties shall promote co-operation and the exchange of experience, information and documentation between the cultural, scholastic, scientific, artistic and literary institutions and organizations of the two countries.
