No. 7821. AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE KINGDOM OF GREECE AND THE SOCIALIST FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA RELATING TO CERTAIN QUESTIONS OF ROAD TRANSPORT. SIGNED AT ATHENS, ON 5 NOVEMBER 1964

The Government of the Kingdom of Greece and the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia have agreed on the following provisions :

Article 1

The Hellenic Government agrees to grant annually to the Yugoslav Government 1,250 authorizations permitting the transport by road of goods in transit, exempt from all duties and taxes, from the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia to the Yugoslav Free Zone of Thessaloniki and vice versa.

The transport operations provided for in the preceding paragraph shall be performed via the road frontier post of Evzoni and shall follow the route Evzoni — Polycastron — Nea Chalkidon — Thessaloniki.

Article 2

In return for the right granted under article 1, the Yugoslav Government agrees to grant annually to the Hellenic Government 300 authorizations permitting the transport by road of goods in transit, exempt from all duties and taxes, from Greece to Yugoslavia or beyond Yugoslavia, through Yugoslav territory, and vice versa.

Article 3

The authorizations provided for in articles 1 and 2 of this Agreement shall be granted independently of the number of authorizations for road transport of goods, exempt from all duties and taxes, granted under the Greco-Yugoslav Agreement of 18 June 1959² establishing regulations for road transport.
