No. 7845. TREATY¹ OF FRIENDSHIP, CO-OPERATION AND MUTUAL ASSISTANCE BETWEEN THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS AND THE POLISH PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC. SIGNED AT WARSAW, ON 8 APRIL 1965

The Presidium of the Supreme Soviet of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the State Council of the Polish People's Republic,

Reaffirming their loyalty to the purposes and principles proclaimed in the Treaty of Friendship, Mutual Assistance and Post-war Co-operation of 21 April 1945² between the Soviet Union and Poland,

Desiring to consolidate the radical change in the relations between the neighbouring peoples of the Soviet Union and Poland which took place during the common struggle against the Hitlerite invaders, and guided by the constant desire to strengthen friendship, co-operation and mutual assistance between the two socialist States,

Convinced that the further development of relations on this basis is in accordance with the vital interests of the peoples of both States, and of the socialist community as a whole, and will contribute to their general development and to the accomplishment of the historic tasks that face them,

Expressing the common resolve of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Polish People's Republic, which consistently pursue the policy of peaceful coexistence among States with different social systems, to strive unswervingly for the strengthening of peace in accordance with the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations,

Noting that, while one of the two German States — the German Democratic Republic — has implemented the principles of the Potsdam Agreement and is effectively promoting security in Europe and the strengthening of international peace, West German militarism is a threat to security in Europe,

Resolved to discharge the obligations arising from the Warsaw Treaty of friendship, co-operation and mutual assistance of 14 May 1955,³
