No. 7872. AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF THE NETHERLANDS AND THE IMPERIAL ETHIOPIAN GOVERNMENT FOR TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION IN THE FIELD OF PUBLIC HEALTH IN THE GOVERNORATE-GENERAL OF KAFFA. SIGNED AT ADDIS ABABA, ON 28 OCTOBER 1964

The Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands and the Imperial Ethiopian Government,

Desiring to strengthen the ties of friendship and to promote the good relations already existing between the two countries,

Recognizing the importance of the Public Health Service in the Governorate-General of Kaffa,

Have agreed as follows :

Article 1

1) The two Governments shall collaborate in the operation of the Public Health Service in the Governorate-General of Kaffa. The functioning of the hospital at Jimma and the training of medical personnel will form integral parts of this collaboration.

2) The Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands shall contribute to the operation of the service by making available expert assistance and equipment during a period of five years.

3) It is the intention of the Imperial Ethiopian Government that responsibility for the operation of the facilities to be provided hereunder shall be gradually assumed by Ethiopian personnel in order that, by the expiration of the term of this Agreement, all Netherlands personnel provided hereunder shall be replaced by qualified Ethiopians.

Article 2

The collaboration between the two Governments in the establishment and operation of the Health Service shall be defined and specified by an administrative agreement (hereafter referred to as the "Plan of Operations"), to be concluded between the competent authorities of the two Governments.
