No. 7960. TRADE AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF CHINA AND THE UNITED MEXICAN STATES.
SIGNED AT MEXICO CITY, ON 25 SEPTEMBER 1964

The Republic of China and the United Mexican States, desiring to strengthen their economic relations and bonds of friendship and to increase trade between the two countries, have resolved to conclude a Trade Agreement based on principles of equality and mutual benefit, and have appointed for that purpose as their plenipotentiaries :

Mr. Hsu Peh-yuan, Governor of the Central Bank of China, President of the Exchange and Foreign Trade Commission of the Executive Yuan of the Republic of China, and

Mr. Plácido García Reynoso, Under-Secretary for Industry and Commerce of the Government of Mexico.

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, agree on the following :

Article I

The Republic of China and the United Mexican States shall endeavour to increase the volume of trade between the two countries. The exchange of goods shall in every case be subject to all import and export laws and regulations which are in force in the respective countries on the date of signature of this Agreement or which may enter into force during the term of the Agreement.

Article II

The Contracting Parties agree to grant each other, reciprocally, unconditional and unrestricted most-favoured-nation treatment. Accordingly, goods originating in and proceeding from the territory of one of the Contracting Parties and constituting items of trade shall be subject on their entry into the territory of the other Party to charges no higher than those which are or may hereafter be imposed on like goods originating in the country which, under the latter Party's Customs system, enjoys the most favourable treatment.
