Excellency :

I have the honor to inform Your Excellency that, in order to facilitate the entry of diplomatic, consular and administrative officers and employees serving in diplomatic missions and career consular offices, as well as officers and employees of governmental agencies of the two countries, the Government of the United States of America is prepared to enter into an agreement with the Government of the United States of Brazil.

The Government of the United States of America shall issue non-immigrant visas free of charge on a reciprocal basis to eligible nationals of the United States of Brazil serving in the United States of America under the conditions set forth in the following schedule :

Officers and employees of diplomatic missions and career consular offices, holders of special passports, and members of immediate family . . . . .	A-2	24 months	multiple
Officers and employees of Brazilian Government agencies, holders of special or service passports, and members of immediate family . . . . .	A-2	12 months	multiple
