NO. 8133. EXCHANGE OF NOTES CONSTITUTING A TRADE AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF AUSTRIA. PARIS, 6 OCTOBER 1950

Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the conversations which took place in Dublin between an Irish and an Austrian trade delegation between the 18th and 24th July, 1950, concerning trade relations between the two countries and to confirm that, in the course of these conversations, agreement was reached on the following points :

(1) In the spirit of the Convention for European Economic Co-operation,² the Governments of Ireland and of Austria desire to develop the interchange of goods and services between the two countries, and to foster, in particular, the exchange of commodities of importance to their respective economies.

(2) The Irish Government undertakes to accord all reasonable facilities for the admission to Ireland of products of Austrian origin and will more especially consider favourably applications for the admission of goods to the export of which the Austrian Government attaches particular importance.

(3) The Austrian Government undertakes to accord all reasonable facilities for the admission to Austria of products of Irish origin and will more especially consider favourably applications for the admission of goods to the export of which the Irish Government attaches particular importance.

(4) In order to facilitate the application of this Agreement, the two Governments have exchanged information regarding the products referred to in paragraphs (2) and (3) and will keep each other informed of any additional items which they desire to include in the trade between their two countries.
