No. 8150. AGREEMENT¹ CONCERNING TECHNICAL AND
SCIENTIFIC CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE GOVERN-
MENT OF THE ROMANIAN PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC AND
THE GOVERNMENT OF THE ITALIAN REPUBLIC.
SIGNED AT BUCHAREST, ON 16 JUNE 1964

The Government of the Romanian People's Republic and the Government of the Italian Republic,

Desiring to develop technical and scientific co-operation between their two countries,

Have decided to conclude the present Agreement and have for this purpose appointed as their plenipotentiaries :

The Government of the Romanian People's Republic : His Excellency Prof. Pompiliu Macovei, Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs;

The Government of the Italian Republic : His Excellency Dr. Alberto Paveri Fontana, Ambassador of Italy at Bucharest;

who, having exchanged their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows :

Article I

The two Contracting Parties are prepared to encourage and promote the development and expansion of scientific and technical co-operation between their countries, particularly in such economic sectors as the basic metal industries and manufacture of machinery, mining and electric energy, the petroleum and chemical industries, the construction industry, communications and transport, forestry, light industry and the food industry, agriculture, construction and architecture, and also in the scientific organization of labour and in other sectors in which the two Parties may be interested.

Article II

With a view to developing and expanding technical and scientific co-operation, the two Parties are prepared to encourage and support, in particular :
