No. 8243. EXCHANGE OF LETTERS CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN BELGIUM AND ISRAEL CONCERNING THE RECIPROCAL DELIVERY FREE OF CHARGE AND THE WAIVER OF ATTESTATION OF COPIES OF OR EXTRACTS FROM CIVIL REGISTRATION DOCUMENTS. BRUSSELS, 26 APRIL 1966

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Belgian Government, with the object of making provision in certain cases for the reciprocal delivery free of charge and the waiver of attestation of copies of or extracts from civil registration documents, is prepared to conclude with the Israel Government an agreement in the following terms :

Article 1

The Belgian Government, for Israel nationals born, recognized, legitimated, adopted, married, divorced or deceased in Belgium, and the Israel Government, for Belgian nationals born, recognized, legitimated, adopted, married, divorced or deceased in Israel, undertake to deliver free of charge to the other Contracting Party faithful copies of or extracts from civil registration documents issued in their respective territories whenever a request therefor is made for administrative purposes.

The Belgian and Israel Governments also undertake to deliver free of charge for the same purpose copies of or extracts from civil registration documents concerning persons other than their respective nationals.

The Belgian and Israel Governments shall deliver free of charge copies of or extracts from civil registration documents requested for their respective nationals who are indigent.

The request shall be addressed to the authority designated by each Contracting Party by the diplomatic mission or by the consuls of the other Party; the reason for the request shall be briefly specified therein, for example : " administrative purpose " or " indigence of the Belgian (or Israel) applicant ".

The delivery of a copy of or an extract from a civil registration document shall not prejudice in any way the question of the nationality of the person concerned so far as the two Governments are concerned.
