No. 8353. TREATY<sup>1</sup> BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF THE NETHERLANDS AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED MEXICAN STATES ON CULTURAL RELATIONS. SIGNED AT MEXICO CITY, ON 8 APRIL 1964

The Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands and  
The Government of the United Mexican States,

Desiring to reinforce the traditional bonds of friendship uniting their two peoples and to strengthen relations between their two countries in the fields of education, science and the arts,

Have decided to conclude a treaty on cultural relations and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries :

The Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands :

His Excellency Mr. J. M. A. H. Luns, Minister for Foreign Affairs ;

The Government of the United Mexican States :

His Excellency Mr. José Gorostiza, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs,

Who, having exchanged their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows :

*Article I*

In order to make each country's culture better known in the other, the Contracting Parties shall, as far as possible, assist each other in :

- (a) The dissemination of books, periodicals and other publications ;
- (b) The arranging of lectures, concerts and dramatic performances ;
- (c) The holding of fine arts and other cultural exhibitions ;
- (d) The organization of radio broadcasts, issuance of recordings, and similar measures ;
- (e) The showing of scientific, educational and cultural films ;
