No. 8530. PROJECT AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY AGENCY AND THE GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN REGARDING ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE TRANSFER OF THERAPEUTIC IRRADIATION EQUIPMENT. SIGNED AT VIENNA, ON 21 DECEMBER 1965 AND 15 MARCH 1966

WHEREAS the Government of Pakistan (hereinafter called "Pakistan"), desiring to set up a radiotherapy centre in Hyderabad, has requested the assistance of the International Atomic Energy (hereinafter called the "Agency") in securing radioisotopes and radiotherapy equipment therefor ;

WHEREAS the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic (hereinafter called "the Soviet Union") has offered to make available to the Agency free of charge equipment for radiotherapy centres ;

WHEREAS Pakistan has informed the Agency that the equipment offered by the Soviet Union would meet its needs ;

WHEREAS the Soviet Union has informed the Agency of its readiness, pursuant to a decision by the Board of Governors of the Agency, to deliver that equipment to Pakistan ;

WHEREAS the Board of Governors of the Agency approved the project on 17 June 1965, and authorized the Director General to conclude with Pakistan a Project Agreement ;

The Agency and Pakistan hereby agree as follows :

Section 1. (a) The Agency will facilitate arrangements for the transfer to Pakistan of the following equipment : a Rum-7 short-focus X-ray unit and a 4000-curie Luch radiocobalt unit (together hereinafter called the "supplied equipment").

(b) The supplied equipment will be installed at the Liaquat Medical College Hospital at Jamshoro.

Section 2. The arrangements for the delivery and installation of the supplied equipment will be made between Pakistan and the Soviet Union. These arrangements shall provide :
