No. 8579. AGREEMENT¹ ON CULTURAL AND SCIENTIFIC CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS AND THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN. SIGNED AT RAWALPINDI, ON 5 JUNE 1965

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan have expressed a desire to conclude the present Agreement with the aim of developing relations and mutual understanding between the two countries by means of closer cooperation and exchanges in the educational, cultural and scientific spheres.

With that aim :

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics has appointed as its plenipotentiary representative His Excellency S. Romanovsky, Chairman of the State Committee of the Council of Ministers of the U.S.S.R. for Cultural Relations with Foreign Countries.

The Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan has appointed as its plenipotentiary representative Kazi Anwarul Huque, Minister for Education, Health, Labour and Social Welfare Government of Islamic Republic of Pakistan.

After exchanging credentials, which were found to be in due form and good order, the plenipotentiary representatives have agreed on the following :

Article I

The Contracting Parties will, so far as is possible and is needed in the light of their requirements, promote the development of cooperation, the exchange of experience and achievements in the sphere of science, higher and public education, health protection, literature, art, sports and tourism by exchanging cultural and educational delegations, groups and individual visits as set out here under.

Article II

The Contracting Parties will promote contacts between scientific establishments of the two countries by exchanging scientists for acquaintance with scientific achievements, by working at scientific institutions, taking part in scientific meetings and delivering lectures, and by exchanging scientific publications of mutual interest.
