No. 8633. AGREEMENT¹ ON CULTURAL AND SCIENTIFIC
CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE UNION OF SOVIET
SOCIALIST REPUBLICS AND UGANDA. SIGNED AT
MOSCOW, ON 24 JULY 1965

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Government of Uganda being desirous of expanding cultural relations between the two countries in the interests of the further development and strengthening of the friendly relations between the Soviet people and the people of Uganda have agreed on the following :

Article I

The Contracting Parties shall strengthen and expand cultural exchanges for their mutual benefit within the framework of the laws operating in each country and on the basis of the principles of respect for sovereignty, non-interference into each other's domestic affairs, and equality.

Article II

The Contracting Parties shall promote, within the scope of their capabilities and requirements, the development of co-operation, the exchange of experience and achievements in science, higher learning and public education, health protection, literature, the arts and sports by exchanging delegations and individual visits; shall encourage mutual acquaintance of their peoples with the culture of the other Contracting Party and with these aims shall invite musical and theatrical companies, actors, shall organise concerts, arts exhibitions, lectures and so on.

The Contracting Parties in accordance with the laws and customs operating in each country shall encourage cultural exchanges between non-governmental organizations of both countries.

Article III

The Contracting Parties shall encourage co-operation on mutual acceptable basis in the field of press, broadcasting and cinema by sending journalists, workers of radio and cinema and by distribution of cinema-films, exchange of radio programmes and musical recordings.
