No. 8743. AGREEMENT¹ ON CULTURAL CO-OPERATION
BETWEEN THE SOCIALIST REPUBLIC OF ROMANIA
AND THE REPUBLIC OF TUNISIA. SIGNED AT BU-
CHAREST, ON 21 APRIL 1966

The Government of the Socialist Republic of Romania and the Government of the Republic of Tunisia, desiring to develop and strengthen friendship and co-operation between their countries in the spheres of science, culture, art, education, public health and sport, thereby contributing to the strengthening of the bonds of friendship between their peoples, have decided to conclude the present Agreement and have for this purpose appointed as their plenipotentiaries :

The Government of the Socialist Republic of Romania : Mr. Vasile Gliga, Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs ;

The Government of the Republic of Tunisia : Mr. Mahmoud Maamouri, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic of Tunisia in the Socialist Republic of Romania,

who have agreed as follows :

Article 1

The two Contracting Parties undertake to encourage the establishment and strengthening of relations between their scientific, educational, cultural and artistic organizations and institutions and to promote exchanges between the two countries in the spheres of science, culture, art, education, public health, the Press, radio and television, cinema and sport, on the basis of mutual respect for the principles of sovereignty, non-intervention in domestic affairs, equality and mutual advantage.

Article 2

The two Contracting Parties undertake to encourage mutual visits by men of letters, artists, scientists, teachers, journalists and sportsmen.

Article 3

The two Contracting Parties shall promote the establishment and strengthening of co-operation between the national commissions for UNESCO of the two countries.
