No. 8854. AGREEMENT<sup>1</sup> BETWEEN THE UNITED NATIONS AND THE GOVERNMENT OF SENEGAL CONCERNING THE ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE FIRST MEETING OF MINISTERS OF THE ECONOMIC COMMUNITY OF WEST AFRICA. SIGNED AT ADDIS ABABA AND DAKAR, ON 8 NOVEMBER 1967

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Whereas, at the invitation of the Government of Senegal (hereinafter referred to as "the Government"), the meetings listed below are to be held at Dakar between 21 November and 1 December 1967 (and are, if necessary, to be prolonged beyond the latter date if the participants so decide):

1. Interim Council of Ministers of the Economic Community of West Africa, 21-24 November 1967;
2. Advisory Committee on Trade in West Africa, 27 November-1 December 1967,

therefore the United Nations and the Government have agreed on the following provisions:

I. PREMISES, EQUIPMENT, UTILITIES AND STATIONERY SUPPLIES

1. The Government shall make available at its expense such conference rooms and offices in the city of Dakar as are necessary for the meetings. These facilities shall include a large hall for plenary meetings accommodating at least 100 participants, three smaller conference rooms for committee meetings, a lounge for delegates and ten offices for ECA secretariat staff and conference staff, including a room for document reproduction and distribution.
2. The Government shall at its expense furnish, equip and maintain in good repair all the aforementioned offices and rooms in such manner as to ensure the effective conduct of the meetings. The large hall for plenary meetings shall be equipped for simultaneous interpretation in two languages, the facilities to include two interpretation booths set up at the Government's expense. The Government shall also provide suitable facilities for reception, information and registration desks, a documents distribution window and a Press office.
