No. 9100. EXCHANGE OF NOTES CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE AUSTRIAN FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN CONCERNING THE COMMONWEALTH WAR CEMETERY AT KLAGENFURT. VIENNA, 10 JANUARY 1968

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan is desirous of concluding an Agreement with the Austrian Federal Government on the status of the Commonwealth War Cemetery at Klagenfurt, Carinthia.

2. Accordingly, I now have the honour to propose an Agreement between the Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and the Austrian Federal Government, in the following terms:

(i) The Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan informs the Austrian Federal Government that the Commonwealth War Graves Commission is the sole organisation authorized by the said Government to care for the Commonwealth War Cemetery at Klagenfurt, Carinthia.

(ii) The Austrian Federal Government recognises the Commonwealth War Graves Commission as being authorized to discharge the task delegated to it under sub-paragraph (i) of the present Agreement, in accordance with paragraph 2 of Article 19 of the State Treaty for the Re-establishment of an Independent and Democratic Austria concluded on the 15th of May, 1955,² between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America and France, of the one part, and Austria, of the other part.

(iii) The Austrian Federal Government grants to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission free of cost the permanent use of the state-owned land described as No. 207/3, land register No. 1472, cadastral community Waidmannsdorf, judicial district Klagenfurt, Carinthia, on which the Commonwealth War Graves Cemetery
