No. 9101. EXCHANGE OF NOTES CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE AUSTRIAN FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA CONCERNING THE COMMONWEALTH WAR CEMETERY AT KLAGENFURT. VIENNA, 28 FEBRUARY 1968

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the Government of Canada is desirous of concluding an Agreement with the Austrian Federal Government on the status of the Commonwealth War Cemetery at Klagenfurt, Carinthia.

2. Accordingly, I now have the honour to propose an Agreement between the Government of Canada and the Austrian Federal Government in the following terms :

(i) The Government of Canada informs the Austrian Federal Government that the Commonwealth War Graves Commission is the sole organization authorized by the Government of Canada to care for the Commonwealth War Cemetery at Klagenfurt, Carinthia.

(ii) The Austrian Federal Government recognizes the Commonwealth War Graves Commission as being authorized to discharge the task delegated to it under sub-paragraph (i) of the present agreement in accordance with paragraph 2 of Article 19 of the State Treaty for the Re-establishment of an Independent and Democratic Austria concluded on the 15th of May, 1955,² between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America, and France, of the one part, and Austria of the other part.

(iii) The Austrian Federal Government grants to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission free of cost the permanent use of the state-owned land described as No. 207/3, land register No. 1472, cadastral community Waidmannsdorf, judicial district Klagenfurt, Carinthia, on which the Commonwealth War Graves Cemetery
