No. 9192. AGREEMENT¹ ON CULTURAL RELATIONS BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS AND THE IMPERIAL GOVERNMENT OF IRAN. SIGNED AT TEHERAN, ON 22 AUGUST 1966

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Imperial Government of Iran, desiring to continue and strengthen co-operation between the two countries in the spheres of education, science, culture, art and sports with a view to ensuring the maximum exchange of information on and knowledge of the aforementioned spheres by means of friendly co-operation, have decided to conclude this Agreement and have for that purpose appointed as their plenipotentiaries :

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics :

S. K. Romanovsky, Chairman of the Committee of the Council of Ministers of the USSR for Cultural Relations with Foreign Countries;

The Imperial Government of Iran :

H. E. Abbas Aram, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Imperial Government of Iran,

who, having exchanged their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows :

Article 1

The Contracting Parties shall strengthen cultural and scientific co-operation between the two countries on the basis of the principles of mutual respect, sovereignty, non-interference in each other's internal affairs, equality and mutual advantage.

Article 2

The Contracting Parties shall promote the expansion of contacts between scientists of the two countries through the exchange of visits.

Article 3

The Contracting Parties shall encourage mutually acceptable exchanges in the field of training and education.
