Mr. Minister,

With a view to facilitating travel between Jamaica and Mexico, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that my Government is willing to conclude an Agreement with the Government of Mexico on the following terms :

a) Mexican Nationals holding valid Mexican passports, from whatever place they may be coming, shall be able to enter Jamaica without the necessity of previously obtaining a Visa.

b) Jamaican Nationals holding valid Jamaican passports, from whatever place they may be coming, shall be able to enter Mexico without the necessity of previously obtaining a Visa.

c) The provisions of the preceding paragraphs shall apply only where the visit does not exceed ninety days.

d) The abolition of visas shall not exempt Mexican Nationals who may be going to Jamaica or Jamaican Nationals who may be going to Mexico, from the obligation to comply with the laws and regulations of the country of destination, concerning the admission, residence (temporary or permanent) and employment or occupation of foreigners, including laws or regulations which may determine that foreigners must obtain Tourist Cards or other similar document. Any traveller who does not satisfy the immigration authorities that these laws and regulations have been complied with, will be refused leave to enter, land or disembark.

e) The provisions of the present Agreement shall not apply to persons carrying diplomatic or official passports, consequently, the Parties reserve the right to continue applying the practice of granting visas to these persons.

f) Mexican Nationals holding valid Mexican passports and who are normally resident in Jamaica will not be required to obtain a re-entry visa to Jamaica when they travel outside, provided that their residence permit remains valid.

g) Jamaican Nationals holding valid Jamaican passports and who are normally resident in Mexico, will not be required to obtain a re-entry visa to Mexico when they travel outside, provided that their residence permit remains valid.
