No. 9292. TREATY¹ OF FRIENDSHIP, CO-OPERATION AND MUTUAL ASSISTANCE BETWEEN THE HUNGARIAN PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC AND THE POLISH PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC. ~~SIGNED AT BUDAPEST, ON 16 MAY 1968~~

The Hungarian People's Republic and the Polish People's Republic,
Striving constantly to develop and strengthen the fraternal friendship, co-operation and mutual assistance, founded on centuries-old tradition, between the two peoples,

Convinced that the further development of relations between the two socialist states is in accordance with the vital interests of their peoples and serves to strengthen the socialist community as a whole,

Expressing their desire to pursue a consistent policy of peaceful coexistence among States with different social systems and to continue their efforts to safeguard peace,

Conscious of the danger to peace posed by the activities of West German militarist and revanchist forces which are seeking to alter the results of the Second World War,

Endeavouring to maintain peace and security in Europe in accordance with their obligations arising out of the Treaty of Friendship, Co-operation and Mutual Assistance signed at Warsaw on 14 May 1955,²

Guided by the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations,

Reaffirming their loyalty to the purposes and principles set out in the Treaty of Friendship, Co-operation and Mutual Aid between the Republic of Hungary and the Republic of Poland signed on 18 June 1948³ and declaring that the said Treaty has played an historic part in the development of relations between the two peoples,

Having regard to the achievements of socialist construction in the two States and the development of political, economic and cultural co-operation between them during the past twenty years as well as the changes which have taken place in the world during that time,

Have agreed as follows :
